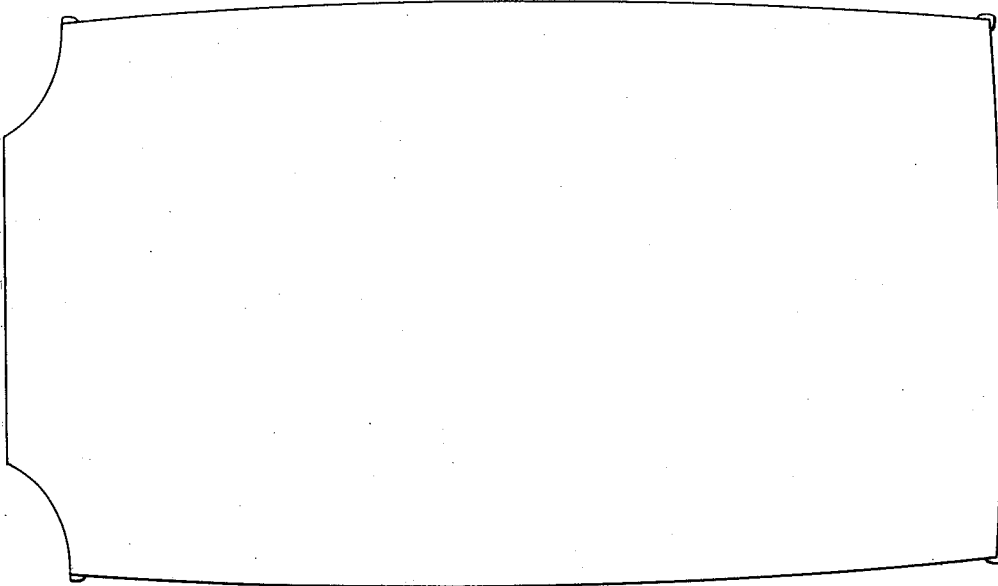

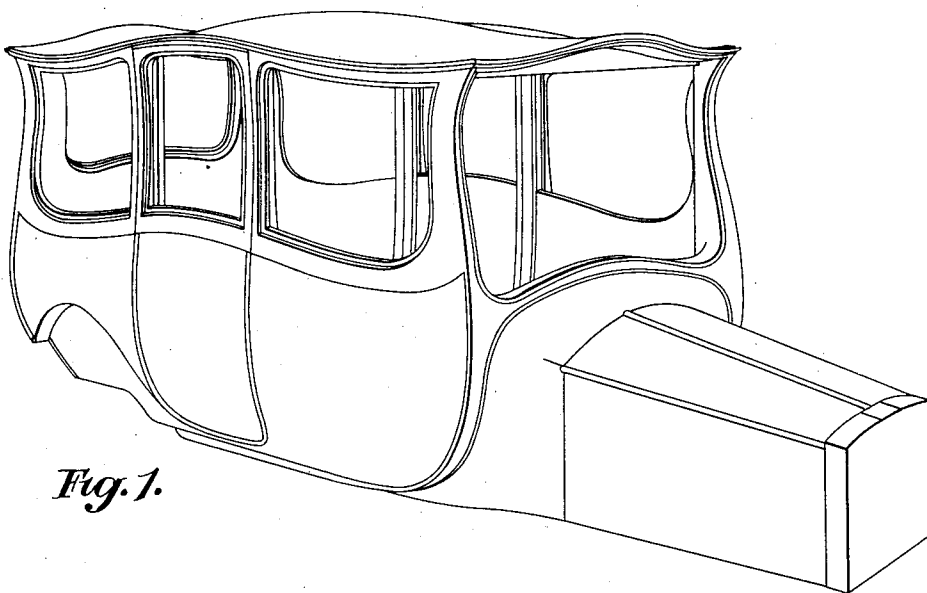

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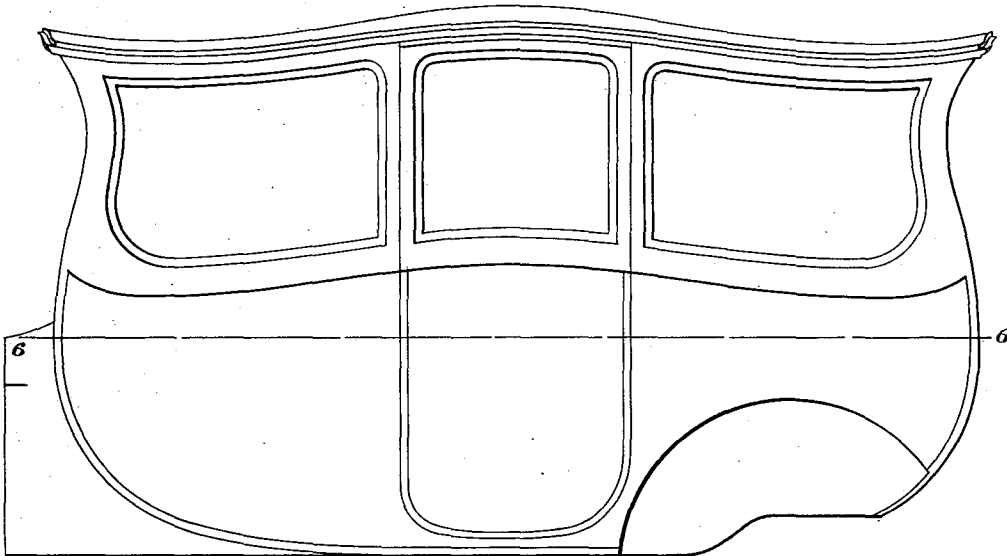
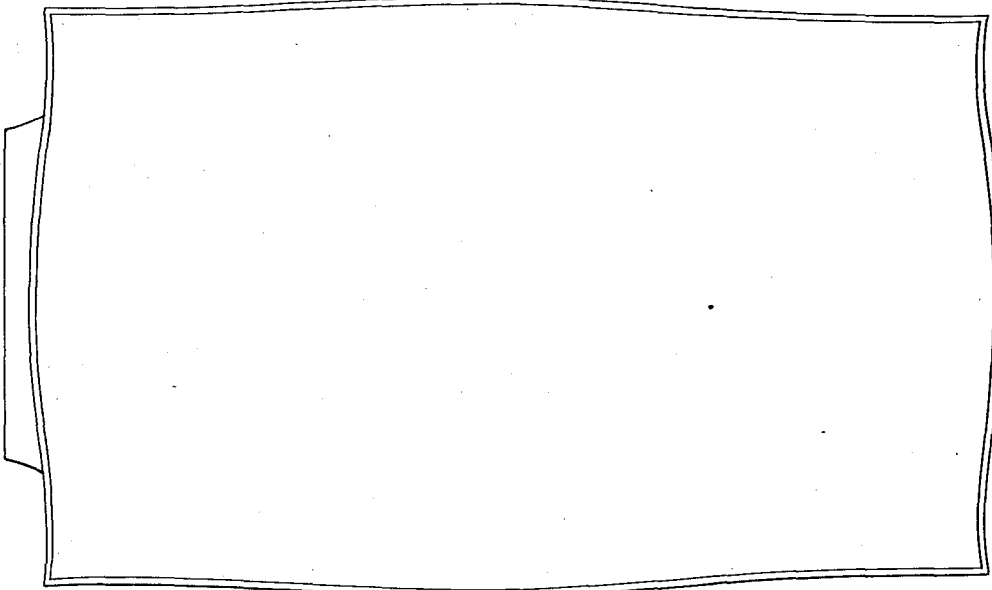

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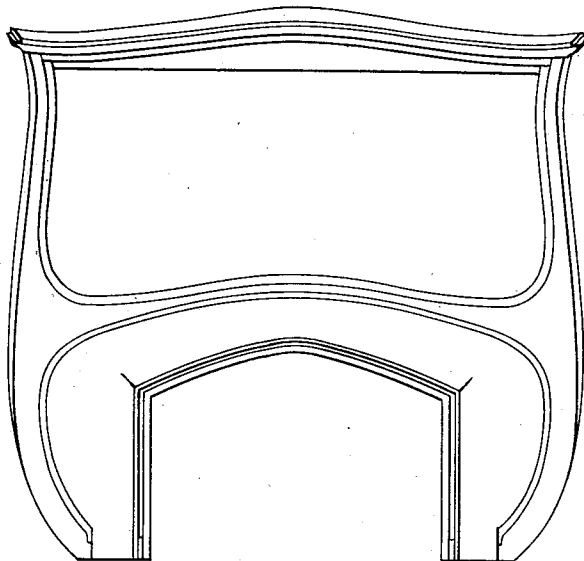

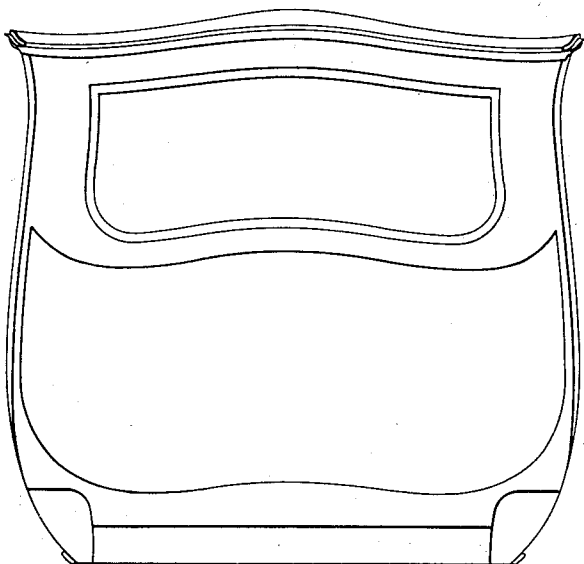

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HELEN LOUISE DAVIDSON, a subject of the King of Great Britain, residing at the city of Toronto, county of York, Province of Ontario, Canada, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Vehicle-Bodies, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view of the vehicle body showing the hood attached thereto. Fig. 2 is a side elevation of the vehicle body without the hood. Fig. 3 is a

plan view of the roof. Figs. 4 and 5 are elevations respectively, of the front and rear ends of the vehicle body, and Fig. 6 is a horizontal view illustrating the configuration of the vehicle body on the line 6—6 Fig. 2.
